Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured to not exceed the emission limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission of the U.S. Government. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The exposure standard for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC is 1.6 W/kq.*

Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions specified by the FCC with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands.

Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is

designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output.

Before a phone model is available for sale to the public, it must be tested and certified to the FCC that it does not exceed the limit established by the government-adopted requirement for safe exposure. The tests are performed in positions and locations (e.g., at the ear and worn on the body) as required by the FCC for each model.

Body-worn measurements differ among phone models, depending upon availability of accessories and FCC requirements. While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the government requirement for safe exposure.

The FCC has granted an Equipment Authorization for this model phone with all reported SAR levels evaluated as in compliance with the FCC RF emission guidelines.

The highest reported SAR values of this phone are:

Optimize your Phone's Performance

Use the instructions in this guide to learn how to optimize the performance and life of your phone and battery.

Air Bags

If you have an air bag, DO NOT place installed or portable phone equipment or other objects over the air bag or in the air bag deployment area. If equipment is not properly installed, you and your passengers risk serious injury.

Medical Devices

Pacemakers—Warning to pacemaker wearers: Wireless phones, when in the 'on' position, have been shown to interfere with pacemakers. The phone should be kept at least six (6) inches away from the pacemaker to reduce risk.

The Health Industry Manufacturers Association and the wireless technology research community recommend that you follow these guidelines to minimize the potential for interference.

- Always keep the phone at least six inches (15 centimeters) away from your pacemaker when the phone is turned on.
- Do not carry your phone near your heart.
- Use the ear opposite the pacemaker.
- If you have any reason to suspect that interference is taking place, turn off your phone immediately.

Hearing aids—Some digital wireless phones may interfere with hearing aids. In the event of such interference, you may want to call the customer service line to discuss alternatives.

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Other medical devices—If you use any other personal medical device, consult the manufacturer of the device to determine if it is adequately shielded from external RF energy. Your physician may be able to help you obtain this information.

In health care facilities—Turn your phone off in health care facilities when instructed. Hospitals and health care facilities may be using equipment that is sensitive to external RF energy.

Potentially unsafe areas

Posted facilities—Turn your phone off in any facility when posted notices require you to do so.

Aircraft—FCC regulations prohibit using your phone on a plane that is in the air. Turn your phone off or switch it to Airplane Mode before boarding aircraft.

Vehicles—RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic systems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer of the device to determine if it is adequately shielded from external RF energy.

Blasting areas—Turn off your phone where blasting is in progress. Observe restrictions, and follow any regulations or rules

Potentially explosive atmospheres—Turn off your phone when you are in any area with a potentially explosive atmosphere. Obey all signs and instructions. Sparks in such areas could cause an explosion or fire, resulting in bodily injury or death. Areas with a potentially explosive atmosphere are often, but not always, clearly marked.

They include:

- · fueling areas such as gas stations
- below deck on boats
- transfer or storage facilities for fuel or chemicals
- vehicles using liquefied petroleum gas, such as propane or butane
- areas where the air contains chemicals or particles such as grain, dust, or metal powders
- any other area where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle engine

Use with Care

Use only in normal position (to ear). Avoid dropping, hitting, bending, or sitting on the phone.

Avoid Magnetic Environments

Keep the phone away from magnets which can cause improper functioning of the phone.

Keep Your Phone Dry

Keep the phone dry. Damage can result if the phone gets wet. Water damage is not covered under warranty.

Resetting the Phone

If the screen seems frozen and the keypad does not respond to key presses, reset the phone by completing the following steps:

- Remove the battery cover.
- 2. Remove and replace the battery.

If the problem persists, return the phone to the dealer for service.

Accessories

Use only Kyocera-approved accessories with Kyocera phones. Use of any unauthorized accessories may be dangerous and will void the phone warranty if said accessories cause damage or a defect to the phone.

Radio Frequency (RF) Energy

Your telephone is a radio transmitter and receiver. When it is on, it receives and sends out RF energy. Your service provider's network controls the power of the RF signal. This power level can range from 0.006 to 0.6 walts.

In August 1996, the U.S. Federal Communications Commission (FCC) adopted RF exposure guidelines with safety levels for hand-held wireless phones. These guidelines are consistent with the safety standards previously set by both U.S. and international standards bodies in the following reports:

- ANSI C95.1 (American National Standards Institute, 1992)
- NCRP Report 86 (National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurements, 1986)

 ICNIRP (International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection, 1996)

Your phone complies with the standards set by these reports and the FCC guidelines.

E911 Mandates

Where service is available, this phone complies with the Phase I and Phase II E911 Mandates issued by the FCC.

Hearing Aid Compatibility (HAC) with Mobile Phones

Some mobile phones and hearing devices (hearing aids and cochlear implants), when used together, result in buzzing, humming, or whining noises detected by the user.

Some hearing devices are more immune than others to this interference noise, and phones also vary in the amount of interference they generate.

The wireless telephone industry has developed ratings for some of their mobile phones, to assist hearing device users in finding phones that may be compatible with their hearing devices. Not all phones have been rated.

Phones that are rated have the rating on their box or a label on the box. The ratings are not guarantees and results will vary depending on the user's hearing device and hearing loss. If your hearing device happens to be vulnerable to interference, you may not be able to use a rated phone successfully. Trying out the phone with your hearing device is the best way to evaluate it for your personal needs.

M-Ratings—Phones rated M3 or M4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to generate less interference to hearing devices than phones that are not labeled. M4 is the better/higher of the two ratings.

T-Ratings—Phones rated T3 or T4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to be more usable with a hearing device's telecoil ("T Switch" or "Telephone Switch") than unrated phones. T4 is the better/higher of the two ratings. (Note that not all hearing devices have telecoils in them.)

Hearing devices may also be measured for immunity to this type of interference. Your hearing device manufacturer or hearing health professional may help you choose the proper rating for your mobile phone. The more immune your hearing aid is, the less likely you are to experience interference noise from mobile phones.

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Phone Battery

Install Battery

- 1. Hold the phone face down.
- 2. Find the notch on the bottom of the phone. It is a rectangle. Using your thumbnail, remove the battery cover by prying it up from the bottom.
- Place the battery in the battery casing. Make sure that the metal contacts of the battery and battery casing touch.
- Replace the battery cover by sliding the notches into the openings on the top of the battery casing.
- 5. Snap the cover into place.








Charge Battery

- The Micro-USB jack is located on top of the phone. Connect the AC adapter to the Micro-USB jack.
- Plug the adapter into a wall outlet.



- Charging (the icon is animated)
- Partially charged
- Fully charged =

You must have at least a partial charge in the battery to make or receive calls. You can safely recharge the battery at any time, even if it has a partial charge.

Note: Before removing the battery, make sure the phone is powered off.

Battery Safety Guidelines

- Do not disassemble or open the battery.
- Do not crush, bend, deform, puncture, or shred the battery.
- Do not attempt to insert foreign objects into the battery.
- Do not immerse the battery or expose it to water or other liquids. Even if a battery appears to dry out and operate normally, internal parts can slowly corrode and cause a safety hazard.
- Always keep the battery between 15 °C and 25 °C (59 °F and 77 °F). Do not expose the battery to extremes of temperature (heat or cold), fire, or other hazards such as a cooking surface, clothes iron, or radiator.
- · Never use any damaged battery.
- Only use the battery for its intended phone.
- Only use the battery with a qualified charger. Use of an unqualified battery charger may present a risk of fire, explosion, leakage, or other hazard. If you are unsure about whether a charger is qualified, contact customer support.
- Do not short-circuit the battery or allow metallic conductive objects—such as keys, coins, or jewelry—to contact the battery's terminals.

- Replace the battery only with another qualified battery. Use of an unqualified battery may present a risk of fire, explosion, leakage, or other hazard. If you are unsure about whether a replacement battery is compatible, contact customer support.
- Promptly dispose of used batteries in accordance with local regulations and recycle if possible. Do not dispose as household waste.
- Supervise all battery usage by children.
- Avoid dropping the phone or battery. If the phone or battery is dropped, especially on a hard surface, an internal short-circuit can occur and pose a safety hazard. If you suspect battery damage, take it to a service center for inspection.

Common Causes of Battery Drain

- Playing games or using the Web.
- Using the flash when taking pictures.
- Setting the backlight to always lit.
- Operating when far away from a base station or cell site.
- Using data cables or accessories.
- Operating when no service is available, or service is available intermittently.
- High earpiece and ringer volume settings.
- Repeating sound, vibration, or lighted alerts.

10 Phone Battery

Memory Card

You can extend the phone's memory with a MicroSD memory card.

Install the Memory Card

- 1. Hold the phone face down.
- Find the notch on the bottom of the phone. It is a rectangle. Using your thumbnail, remove the battery cover by prying it up from the bottom.
- Make sure that the metal contacts are facing down, securely slide the memory card into the inner part of the slot.



- Replace the battery cover by sliding the notches into the openings on the top of the battery casing.
- 5. Snap the cover into place.

Note: A notification appears when the card is ready for use. Do not use the card until you see the notification.

Format Memory Card

From Accessories, select Memory Card > Format Card > Yes to format your memory card.

Note: Formatting will erase all current information on the memory card.

Remove Memory Card

- 1. Hold the phone face down.
- 2. Find the notch on the bottom of the phone. It is a rectangle. Using your thumbnail, remove the battery cover by prying it up from the bottom.



- 3. Remove the memory card from the slot.
- Replace the battery cover by sliding the notches into the openings on the top of the battery casing.
- 5. Snap the cover into place.

Phone Overview

Get to Know Your Phone

The following shows the front of the phone.

- 1. Earpiece speaker.
- Touch screen. Your phone has a touch-activated screen. Touch objects on the screen to select them. The initial state of the phone is referred to as the home screen.

Note: To prevent damage, do not use sharp objects on the touch screen.

- Menu key accesses the Menu.
- Send key starts or answers a call. Press once to display the recent calls list or twice to redial the last number dialed. Press and hold to activate voice commands.
- 5. Navigation key scrolls to objects on the screen. The Navigation key has an optical sensor that allows it to sense your finger. To scroll, swipe your finger across the Navigation key left, right, up or down. Objects are highlighted as you scroll to them. You can press the Navigation key or touch the screen to select an object.
- Power key turns on the phone. Press and hold the Power key to turn the phone on or off.
 When the phone is on, press the Power key to lock or unlock the touch screen. This prevents accidental touches.
- 7. Back key returns you to the previous screen.
- End key ends a call or browser session. You can also return to the home screen, when you press the End key.

Note: The End key does not turn on the phone. Use the Power key to turn the phone on or off.



The following shows the back of the phone.

- 1. Accessory eyelet (for optional straps and lanyards).
- Jack for AC adapter (included) and Micro-USB cable (sold separately).
- 3. Camera lens.
- Power key turns on the phone. Press and hold the Power key to turn the phone on or off. When the phone is on, press the Power key to lock or unlock the touch screen. This prevents accidental touches.
- 5. Jack for a hands-free headset (sold separately).
- 6. External speaker.
- Camera key activates camera mode. Press and hold the Camera key to activate camera mode.
- 8. Volume key raises or lowers ringer volume.

Warning: Inserting an accessory into the incorrect jack will damage the phone.



Home Screen

The home screen refers to the initial state of the phone. This is also called the idle state. The home screen has the following elements:

- Top row icons. The top row of the screen has a set of small icons that display signal strength, battery life, message alerts, and other information.
- Display controls. Change the display options of the home screen.
- Banner area. The banner displays a greeting banner, date, and time.
- 4. Shortcuts. Your phone has the following shortcuts:
 - Messages to view messages.
 - Phone to call a number.
 - Main Menu to access the menu screen.
 - Contacts to view contacts.



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Menu Screen

From the home screen, touch **Main Menu** to access the menu screen. The menu screen has the following elements:

- 1. Top row icons.
- 2. Tabs. Switch the menu that you are viewing. Choose one of the following:
 - Menu to access the phone menu.
 - Apps to access applications.
 - Weblinks to access web sites.
- Menu area. The current menu you are viewing. To move a menu item to the home screen, touch and hold it
- 4. Option bar. Touch **Storefront** to buy more applications or **Close** to return to the home screen.

Note: The menu items on your phone can change depending on the applications provided by your service provider.



Message Screen

From **Messages**, you will see the following screen. This screen has the following elements that are commonly used throughout your phone's software:

- 1. Top row icons.
- 2. Title. The title displays your current location.
- Work space. The work space is where you can complete tasks. For example, the message screen has a list of threads in the work space.
- Option bar. The option bar displays the most frequent options used. The option bar can contain icons or words.

Guide Conventions

In this guide, the following conventions are used when describing phone features.

Touch means to touch an area on the screen. For example, "Touch **Done**" means to physically touch the word **Done** on your phone screen.

Press means to use a phone key. For example, "Press the **Send** key to make a phone call" tells you to physically press the **Send** key on your phone.

Scroll means to use the Navigation key to move through a list on the display. For example, "Scroll through your contacts list to choose a contact" means to physically swipe the Navigation key up or down to scroll through the list on the display.

Select means to choose an option. For example, "Select Settings" means to physically press the Navigation to select the highlighted Settings option. You can also touch Settings to select it.

> (greater than symbol) tells you to select an option from a menu or list. For example,

- "Settings > Accessories" means to:
- 1. From the main menu, touch Settings.
- 2. Scroll to the Accessories option.
- Touch Accessories.

2 Messages

Use **Messages** to manage messages on your phone.

View All Message Threads

All messages are displayed as a list of threads. A thread is group of messages sent between you and a contact, number or email address. The thread with the most recent message is displayed first.

- From Messages, all message threads are displayed. Threads are displayed in the following ways:
 - Unread threads are in bold text. The number of messages in the thread is shown in parenthesis after the address of the sender, for example **Luthor Bone** (5). If there is only one message in a thread, no number is displayed.
 - Read threads are in plain text. Messages with attachments or messages that are locked are designated by applicable icons.
 - Drafts are designated by an icon.
 - Browser alerts are designated by an icon.
 - Scheduled messages are designated by an icon. These messages will be sent at the time set by you.
 - Pending messages are designated by an icon. These messages will be sent when possible.
 - Failed messages are designated by an icon. These messages cannot be sent.

- 2. At the thread list, you can do the following:
 - Touch a thread to view messages in the thread. When viewing a thread, touch a message to view that individual message.
 - Touch New to create a new message.
 - Touch More icon to access more features.

Create a Message

You can only send messages to phone numbers capable of receiving them or to email addresses. If the character and file size limit for a single message is exceeded, the message must be edited to meet the size limitation.

- 1. From Messages, touch New.
- At the compose screen, enter a recipient's phone number or email address. Touch Add icon to access contacts, groups or recently used addresses.
- If applicable, enter a subject.
- 4. Enter a message.
- If applicable, touch Attach to select a file from your phone or to create a new file to send with your message.
- If applicable, touch More icon to access more features.
- When done, touch Send.

If you receive a call while creating a message, a notification appears. Do one of the following:

- Touch **Ignore** to ignore the call and return to the compose screen.
- Press the **Send** key to answer the call.
 Your message is automatically saved as a draft.

Reply to a Message

When receiving a message, your phone displays a notification and a message icon appears at the top of the screen. The message icon flashes an urgent message alert if the message is urgent.

- When a message notification appears, touch View. If you want to view the message later, touch Ignore. The message icon will remain when you have an unread message.
- 2. When viewing a message, touch Reply.
- 3. Complete your message.

Compose Message Options

Save Message as a Draft

When composing a message, select **More icon** > **Save as Draft** when entering the text. Your phone saves the message as a draft to complete at a later time.

Save Preset Text

- When composing a message, select More icon > Save as Preset Text when entering the text to use it later as preset text.
- 2. Complete your message.

Take a Picture

- When composing a message, select Attach > Camera.
- 2. Take a picture.
- 3. Complete your message.

Record a Sound

- When composing a message, select Attach > Record Sound
- 2. Record the sound.
- 3. Complete your message.

Attach a Media File

- When composing a message, select Attach > Media Gallery.
- 2. Select a file.
- 3. Complete your message.

Attach a Contact

- When composing a message, select Attach > Contacts.
- 2. Select a contact.
- 3. Complete your message.

Attach an Event

- When composing a message, select Attach > Events.
- 2. Select an event.
- 3. Complete your message.

Request a Message Receipt

- When composing a message, select More icon > Delivery > Message Receipt > On to request a message delivery notice.
- 2. Complete your message.

Set Message Priority

- When composing a message, select More icon > Delivery > Priority.
- 2. Select a priority level.
- 3. Complete your message.

Request a Message Read Receipt

- When composing a message, select More icon > Message Read Receipt > On to request a message read notice.
- Complete your message.

Set the Validity Period

- When composing a message, select More icon > Validity Period to set how long to keep your message valid before removing it from the phone if not sent.
- 2. Touch **Time** to change the time.
- 3. Touch Date to change the date.
- 4. Touch Set.
- Complete your message.

Enable CC and BCC Fields

- When composing a message, select More icon > Add CC/BCC to enable the CC and BCC address fields.
- 2. Complete your message.

Add Slides to Messages

Use slides in a message to send multiple files, such as pictures or voice memos. The options to add more slides can only be used once you have attached an initial media file.

- When composing a message, select More icon > Add New Slide.
- Select a slide and add more files or text if needed.

To navigate through the slides, select **More** icon > Next Slide or Previous Slide. To erase the current slide, select **More icon** > Erase Slide.

3. Complete your message.

The number of slides you can attach is limited by the available memory space and the file size of the attachments.

Set the Slide Interval

- When composing a message, select More icon > Slide Interval.
- 2. Select a time interval for the slides.
- Complete your message.

Cancel a Message

When composing a message, select **More icon** > **Cancel Msg** to cancel the message.

Text Entry Options

Enter Text with Grid Keyboard

- When composing a message, touch a text entry field.
- 2. At the keyboard, you can do one of the following:
 - Touch keyboard to enter text. Press a key once for the first letter, twice for the second letter, and so on. If your phone is set to Spanish, accented letters are available. Wait for the cursor to move right and enter the next character.
 - Touch Abc to enter letters.
 - Touch SYM to enter numbers and symbols.
 - Touch Back icon to erase characters.
 - Touch Space to enter a space.
 - Touch Shift icon to change the letter case.
 - Touch More icon to access more options.
 - Touch **Done** to close the keyboard.

Enter Text with Half OWERTY

- When entering text, select More icon >
 Half QWERTY Keyboard to access the
 half QWERTY keyboard.
- 2. When finished, touch **Done**.

To return to the grid keyboard, select **Grid Keyboard**.

Enter Text with Full OWERTY

- When entering text, select More icon > Full QWERTY Keyboard to access the full QWERTY keyboard.
- 2. When finished, touch **Done**.

To return to the grid keyboard, select **Grid Keyboard**.

Enter Numbers and Symbols

- When entering text, touch SYM. The keyboard changes to show numbers and symbols.
- Enter characters as needed. Go to the next screen to see more characters.

To return to letter keyboard, touch Abc.

Change Letter Case

Your phone enters letters in sentence case. You can change this to upper or lower case, if needed.

When entering text, touch and hold **Shift icon** to change the letter case mode. The keyboard will change accordingly.

To change case for next letter only, touch **Shift** icon.

Add Smileys

- When entering text, touch More icon > Add Smiley. The keyboard changes to smileys.
- Select a smiley. Go to the next screen to see more smileys.

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3. When finished, touch **Done**.

To return to letter keyboard, touch Abc.

Insert Preset Text

- 1. When entering text, select **More icon** > **Preset Text** to use a preset text message.
- 2. Select a text message.
- 3. When finished, touch Done.

Use Word Recognition

When you create a message, your phone can speed up word completion. Your phone uses a dictionary to guess words that you are trying to spell.

- When entering text, select More icon > Turn eZi On to activate word recognition.
- Enter a series of letters, then select a word from the choices provided. If the choices do not fit on the screen, touch More icon to see all the words. To add a word to the your phone dictionary, select Add Word.

For example to enter the word "Wyoming", touch the w > y > o keys and touch **Wyoming**. To turn off word recogntion, select **Turn eZi Off**

Enter Text in Spanish

- When entering text, select More icon > Spanish Writing Language to enter text with Spanish characters.
- 2. When finished, touch **Done**.

Enter Text in English

- When entering text, select More icon > English Writing Language to enter text with English characters.
- 2. When finished, touch **Done**.

Thread List Options

- Select threads to delete. A mark appears next to each selection. You can also remove marks
- 3. Touch **Delete > Yes** to confirm.

Note: You cannot recover deleted information.

Delete All Threads

- From Messages, select More icon > Delete All.
- 2. Touch Yes to confirm.

Note: You cannot recover deleted information.

View Thread Options

Reply to a Thread

- When viewing a thread, touch **Reply**. All thread recipients are included in the reply.
- 2. Complete your message.

Call Sender

When viewing a thread, touch **Call** to call the sender of the most recent message in the thread

Lock Multiple Messages

- When viewing a thread, select More icon > Lock/Unlock.
- Select messages to lock. A mark appears next to each selection. You can also remove marks.
- 3. Touch Done to confirm.

Note: Locked messages cannot be deleted.

View Thread Recipients

When viewing a thread, select **More icon** > **Recipient** to see addressees of the thread.

Delete Multiple Messages

- When viewing a thread, select More icon > Delete Multiple.
- Select messages to delete. A mark appears next to each selection. You can also remove marks.
- 3. Touch **Delete > Yes** to confirm.

Note: You cannot recover deleted information.

Delete All Messages in a Thread

- When viewing a thread, select More icon > Delete All.
- 2. Touch Yes to confirm.

Note: You cannot recover deleted information.

View Message Options

Reply to a Message

- 1. When viewing a message, touch **Reply**.
- 2. Complete your message.

Call Sender

When viewing a message, touch **Call** to call the sender of the message.

Reply to All Recipients

- When viewing a message with multiple recipients, select More icon > Reply All. All message recipients are included in the reply.
- At the compose screen, complete your message.
- 3. When done, touch Send.

Forward a Message

- When viewing a message, select More icon > Forward.
- 2. Complete your message.
- 3. When done, touch Send.

View Attachments

When viewing a message, touch an attachment to view the file. If applicable, touch the screen icons to control the playback. Touch **Done** to exit.

Save Attachments

When viewing a message, select the applicable save option to save attachments, including graphics, sounds, contacts (vCard) or events (vCal). For example to save a contact, select **More icon > Save Contact(s)**.

View Message with Multiple Slides When viewing a message with multiple slides, the slideshow automatically begins. Touch the screen icons to control the playback.

Save Message as Preset Text When viewing a message, select **More icon** > **Save as Preset Text** to use it later as preset text

Lock a Message

When viewing a message, select **More icon** > **Lock/Unlock** to protect it from accidental deletion.

Call a Number in a Message

- When viewing a message, press the Send key to extract valid numbers and addresses.
- 2. Touch the number to you want to call.

Go to a Web Address

- When viewing a message, press the Send key to extract valid numbers and addresses.
- 2. Touch a web address to launch the browser.

View Message Recipients

When viewing a message, select **More icon** > **Recipient** to see addressees of the message.

View Message Information

When viewing a message, select **More icon** > **Message Info** to see the message details.

Delete a Message

- When viewing a message, select More icon > Delete.
- 2. Touch Yes to confirm.

Note: You cannot recover deleted information.

Message Settings

Message settings affect all messages unless you change them for an individual message. From **Messages**, select **More icon > Settings** to modify the following features.

Set Message Alert

- From Alerts > Message Alerts, touch Sounds. You can also turn off alert or set your phone to vibrate.
- Select a new sound for your message alerts.
 If you select an & Remind alert, the phone notifies you once when receiving a new alert and notifies you again every five minutes. To dismiss a reminder alert, touch Close.

Set Page Alert

- From Alerts > Page Alerts, touch Sounds.
 You can also turn off alert or set your phone to vibrate.
- 2. Select a new sound for your page alerts. If you select an & Remind alert, the phone notifies you once when receiving a new alert and notifies you again every five minutes. To dismiss a reminder alert, touch Close.

Set Notifications

From **Alerts > Notification**, select one of the following:

- Msg & Icon displays a message and an icon when you receive a notification.
- Icon Only displays only an icon when you receive a notication.

Edit Preset Messages

Your phone comes with preset messages, such as "Please call me," which you can insert into the body of a text message. You can edit or create up to 40 preset messages.

- From Edit Preset Text, do one of the following:
 - Touch an existing message to edit it.
 - Touch **New** to create a new preset message.
- 2. Enter or edit the text.
- 3 Touch Save

Note: You can also save messages you have written or received as preset messages.

Set Callback Number

Your phone number is the default callback number on sent messages. Do the following to change it:

- From Callback Number, select one of the following:
 - MDN sends your phone number. Touch OK to confirm.
 - None sends no callback number. Touch OK to confirm.
 - Custom allows you to enter a number.
- 2. Enter a number and touch **Done**.
- 3. Touch OK to confirm.

Enable Auto-Erase

Use **Auto-Erase** to set your phone to erase messages automatically when it needs memory for incoming messages.

From Auto-Erase, select one of the following:

- Disabled erases no messages.
- Received Messages erases old received messages when memory is needed.
- Sent Messages erases old sent messages when memory is needed.
- Both erases old received and sent messages when memory is needed.

Set Text Entry Mode

From **Entry Mode**, select one of the following:

- Abc to enter text letter by letter in sentence case
- ABC to enter text letter by letter in uppercase.
- 123 to enter numbers.
- · Rapid to enter text with word recognition.

Request Delivery Receipts

From Message Receipt, select On to request a notification when a recipient has received your message.

Enable Auto View

From Auto View, select one of the following:

- Off turns off auto view and prompts you before downloading any messages with multimedia content.
- On turns on auto view to automatically download messages with multimedia content.

Request Read Receipts

From Message Read Receipt, select On to request a notification when a recipient has read your message.

Check Message Count

From **Message Count**, check how many messages are stored on your phone.

Use Phone to access your call features.

Phone Menu

Select Phone to access the following features:

Dialer

From Dialer, you can dial numbers.

Make Phone Calls

Make sure you are in an area where a signal can be received. Look for the signal strength icon on the home screen. The more bars, the stronger the signal. If there are no bars, move to where the signal strength is better.

There are several ways you can make a phone call.

Dial a Number

- 1. From Dialer, enter a phone number.
- 2. Touch Call to dial the number.

Call a Contact

- From Contacts, touch All to view all your contacts.
- Touch Call icon next to the contact you wish to dial

Redial a Number

From **Call History**, touch **Call icon** next to the contact or number you wish to dial.

End a Call

To end a phone call, press the **End** key.

Use Voice Commands

You can use voice commands to call a contact from your voice dial list or to dial a phone number. For more information, see "Voice Commands" on page 78.

Use Fast Find

You can find contacts quickly when **Fast Find** is enabled.

- From Dialer, enter the numbers corresponding to the letters of the name you want to find.
- 2. Touch **Hide** to view the results.
- 3. Touch a contact to make a phone call or touch the entry field to do a new search.

To enable fast find, see "Enable Fast Find" on page 63.

Answer Phone Calls

When a call comes in, the phone rings, vibrates, or lights up. The phone number of the caller also appears if it is not restricted. If the number is stored in your contacts list, the contact's name appears.

There are several ways you can respond to an incoming call.

Answer a Call

When you receive a call alert, touch **Call icon** to answer the call

Silence a Call

When you receive a call alert, touch **Silence** to quiet the alert. You can either touch **Call icon** to answer or let it go to voicemail (if applicable).

Adjust Volume during a Call

During a call, press the **Volume** key up or down to adjust the earpiece volume.

Use Speaker during a Call

This feature works as a toggle. During a call, touch **Speaker** to activate the speakerphone. Touch **Speaker** to turn off the speakerphone.

Mute Sound during a Call

This feature works as a toggle. During a call, touch **Mute** to silence the microphone. Touch **Mute** to turn on the microphone.

Use Bluetooth Device during a Call

During a call, touch **Bluetooth icon** to connect to a paired Bluetooth device. Touch **Bluetooth icon** again to disconnect.

Emergency Services

Call Emergency Services

You can call an emergency code even if your phone is locked or your account is restricted. When you call, your phone enters emergency mode. This enables the emergency service exclusive access to your phone to call you back, if necessary. To make or receive regular calls after dialing the code, you must exit this mode

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To dial an emergency code:

- From **Dialer**, enter the 3-digit emergency code.
- 2. Touch Call.

Exit Emergency Services

- When you have completed an emergency call, press the End key.
- Touch Exit again to confirm your choice.Note: To determine who has access to your location, see "Set Location Information" on page 68.

This timer tracks all calls made and received in your home network since you last reset the timer. To reset this timer to zero, touch **Home Calls** and select **Reset > Yes**.

View Roam Calls Timer

When viewing a call log, select **More icon > Call Timers** to view the total **Roam Calls** call time

This timer tracks all roaming calls made and received in your home network since you last reset the timer. To reset this timer to zero, touch **Roam Calls** and select **Reset > Yes**. Your phone can alert you with a short beep ten seconds before each minute passes during a call. For more information, see "Enable Minute Alert" on page 64.

View Incoming Calls Timer

When viewing a call log, select **More icon > Call Timers** to view the total **Incoming Calls** call time

This timer tracks all calls received since you last reset the timer. To reset this timer to zero, touch **Incoming Calls** and select **Reset > Yes**.

View Outgoing Calls Timer

When viewing a call log, select **More icon** > **Call Timers** to view the total **Outgoing Calls** call time

This timer tracks all calls made since you last reset the timer. To reset this timer to zero, touch **Outgoing Calls** and select **Reset > Yes**.

View Data Counter

When viewing a call log, select **More icon** > **Kilobyte Counter** to track the amount of kilobytes sent during data calls. Select **Done** when finished.

This counter tracks kilobytes for data calls made, data calls received, and total data. To reset the counter to zero, select **More icon** > **Reset** > **Yes**.

Delete Multiple Records

- When viewing a call log, select More icon
 Delete.
- Select records to delete. A mark appears next to each selection. You can also remove marks.
- Select Delete > Yes to confirm.

Delete All Records

- When viewing a call log, select More icon
 > Delete All.
- Touch Yes to confirm.

Voicemail

Configure your Voicemail

Before your phone can receive voicemail messages, you need to set up a password and record a personal greeting with your service provider.

When you have set up your voicemail, all unanswered calls to your phone are automatically transferred to voicemail, even if your phone is in use or turned off.

- From Phone, touch Call icon next to Voicemail
- Follow the system prompts to create a password and record a greeting.

Note: From **Dialer**, you can touch and hold 1 to access voicemail.

Check your Voicemail

When you receive a voicemail message, a notification with a voicemail message icon appears at the top of your screen.

- At the voicemail notification, touch **Listen** to call your voicemail number and follow the system prompts to retrieve the message. Touch **Close** to clear the notification without checking messages. The notification icon remains on top of the screen until you listen to the message.
- When only the voicemail message icon appears on top of the screen, touch and hold 1 on the **Dialer**. Follow the system prompts to retrieve the message.

Voicemail Settings

From **Voicemail**, you can access the following features.

Launch Visual Voicemail

From Phone, select Voicemail > Visual Voicemail to manage voicemail visually on your phone. For more information on the availability of Visual Voicemail contact your service provider.

Your phone has a camera. Before using your phone's camera, here are some tips:

- You cannot activate the camera while on an active call or while browsing files in the gallery.
- Once the camera is active, the screen acts as the viewfinder.
- If you get a "Low memory" error, check your resolution and quality compression settings.
- If there is no activity after you turn your camera on, the camera times out and returns to the previous launch point.
- Menu settings and options can only be accessed when the camera is active.
- Numbers in the bottom right corner indicate the number of snapshots remaining before the phone runs out of memory.

Take a Picture

- To activate the camera, press and hold the Camera key. You can also select Camera from the main menu.
- Focus on the image using the phone's display as a viewfinder.

- To take a picture, touch Camera icon. You can also press the Navigation key. The picture is saved to My Photos. You can do one of the following:
 - Press the Camera key to take another picture.
 - Touch **Send** to send the picture.
 - Touch **Delete** to erase the picture.
 - Press the Back key to exit.

Send Picture with Message

- 1. Take a picture.

Send Picture via Bluetooth

Set Resolution

From **Resolution**, set the resolution for your pictures.

A higher resolution setting will increase the size of the picture files. Using the highest resolution setting will disable the camera zoom

Set Self Timer

From **Self Timer**, set a countdown time for your next picture.

An icon on the viewfinder indicates the timer is activated. When you take a picture, the countdown time will pass before the shutter snaps the picture.

Enable Time Stamp

From **Date/Time**, select **On** to place a time stamp on each picture taken.

An icon indicates when the time stamp is activated.

Enable Multishot

From **Multishot**, select **On** to take multiple pictures.

An icon indicates when multishot mode is activated. When you take a picture, press and hold the **Camera** key to take multiple pictures. A single tone plays for each picture taken.

Your camera is set to a lower resolution during multishot mode. The resolution setting returns to the previous settting when you are done.

Set Shutter Sound

From **Shutter Sound**, select a sound to play when the shutter takes a picture.

Set Color Tone

- From Color Tone, scroll left or right to adjust the color tone setting. Look at the viewfinder to see how each setting looks.
- 2. Touch Set to save.

Set White Balance

- From White Balance, scroll left or right to adjust the white balance setting. Look at the viewfinder to see how each setting looks.
- 2. Touch Set to save.

Set Picture Quality

From **Picture Quality**, set the compression level for your pictures. A higher compression level produces a higher picture quality.

A higher compression level will increase the size of the picture files.

Set Save Location

- From Save Location, select Save to Memory Card to save pictures to your memory card.
- 2. Touch Yes to confirm.

To save pictures to your phone, select **Save to Phone**. If you remove your memory card, pictures will be saved to your phone.

12 Bluetooth

The Bluetooth® wireless technology (not available on all phones) enables wireless connectivity with accessories such as portable or installed hands-free car kits, phones, handsets, computers, and so on. For details, check with your service provider.

You must use a Bluetooth device (compatible with Class 2 Bluetooth wireless technology, version 1.2) in order to use this phone wirelessly. Bluetooth accessories display a symbol on your phone.

From **Bluetooth**, you can access the following features.

Enable Bluetooth

Before you can connect your phone with a Bluetooth device, you need to enable the Bluetooth feature on your phone.

From **Bluetooth**, touch **On**. If your phone does not automatically find a device, you will be prompted to find one.

Manage Bluetooth Devices

Pair with a Device

To enable your phone to communicate with a Bluetooth device, you need to "pair" the device with your phone. The following instructions describe the process. You may also need to reference the user guide provided with your Bluetooth device.

- Prepare the Bluetooth device (accessory) for pairing as described in the device's user guide.
- From My Devices, touch Find. Your phone then searches and detects any available Bluetooth device in the vicinity. The Bluetooth feature on your phone must be enabled to find devices.
- At the device list, select a device. If prompted, accept the pairing.
- If necessary, enter the password provided with the Bluetooth device.
- Touch **OK** to add the device to your device list.

Note: If the device is not trusted, you can change the security setting to pair with it.

Connect to a Device

Before you can use Bluetooth, you must get your phone ready to communicate with a device. This is called "connecting". Some devices will attempt to automatically connect to your phone when the Bluetooth feature is turned on. To connect manually, do the following:

- From My Devices, select a device.
- 2. At the device detail screen, touch Connect.
- Touch **OK** to clear the notification. You can now use the device with your phone.

Note: To disconnect from a Bluetooth device, touch **Disconnect**.

Rename a Device

- 1. From My Devices, select a device.
- Touch Rename.
- 3. Enter a name, then touch **Done**.

Set Device Security

- From My Devices, select a device.
- Touch Set Security and select one of the following:
 - Always Ask to confirm every Bluetooth request from this device.
 - Always Connect to automatically connect to this device.

View Device Services

A Bluetooth device paired with your phone may have more than one service profile (such as Headset, Handsfree, and so on).

- From My Devices, select a device.
- 2. Touch **View Services** to check the services available

Delete a Device

- 1. From My Devices, select a device.
- 2. Touch **Delete > Yes** to confirm.

Set Phone's Name

You can change the name presented for other Bluetooth devices' search of your phone.

From **My Name**, enter a new name and touch **Done**.

Limit Visibility

You can limit the time your phone is visible to other Bluetooth devices.

From **Visibility**, select an option to set the phone visible for your selected time before becoming invisible.

Enable OBEX Authentication

From **OBEX Authentication**, select **Enabled**. With object exchange (OBEX) authentication enabled, you need a user name and password to transfer files via Bluetooth.

View Supported Services

Select **Available Services** to view a list of the Bluetooth service profiles your phone supports.

Use **Bluetooth** to configure your devices. See "Bluetooth" on page 60 for more information.

Convenience

From **Convenience**, you can modify the following features.

Enable Airplane Mode

While in an airplane, it is normally required that you turn off your mobile phone because it emits RF signals that interfere with air traffic control. In airplane mode, however, your phone does not emit RF signals. You cannot make or receive calls, send text messages, use a browser or bluetooth devices, but you can play games, use the calendar, set the clock, and make emergency calls to designated emergency numbers. Please check with uniformed personnel before operating your phone in airplane mode.

- From Airplane Mode, touch OK to clear the notification.
- 2. Select **Enabled** to activate airplane mode. With airplane mode enabled, you can set the time and date manually.

Set Date and Time

In Airplane mode, you can set the time and date manually.

Note: You can only access Set Date and Time with Airplane Mode enabled.

- 1. From Set Date and Time, touch Time.
- 2. Enter the time, then touch **Done**.
- 3. Touch Date.
- Enter the date, then touch **Done**.
- 5. Touch Set to save.

Enable Screen Lock

From Automatic Screen Lock, select Enabled to activate screen lock

With **Automatic Screen Lock** enabled, the screen will automatically lock after a period of inactivity. To unlock the phone, touch the prompt on the phone.

Enable Fast Find

From **Fast Find**, select **Enabled** to activate fast find.

With **Fast Find** enabled, touch the keys corresponding to the letters of the contact you want to find when dialing a number. A matching contact appears. Press the **Send** key to dial the number

Enable Frequent List

From Frequent List, select Enabled.

With **Frequent List** enabled, a list of frequently called contacts are listed first when contacts are accessed from the home screen.

Fnable Minute Alert

From **Minute Alert**, select **Enabled**. Your phone alerts you with a short beep ten seconds before each minute passes during a call.

Set Missed Call Alert

From **Missed Call Alert**, select an alert type for missed calls.

If you select an & Remind alert, the phone notifies you once when receiving a new alert and notifies you again every five minutes. To dismiss a reminder alert, touch Close.

Display

From **Display**, you can modify the following features.

Set Brightness

- From Brightness, use the slider control to adjust the brightness.
- 2. Touch Set to save.

Set Language

From Language, select a language.

Set Backlight

From **Backlighting**, set how long the display's backlight remains bright after the last screen touch.

Note: To maximize the battery life, set a shorter duration for the backlight.

Sound and Touch

From **Sound and Touch**, you can modify the following features.

Enable Roam Ringer

From **Roam Ringer**, select **Enabled** to activate a specific ringer for roaming calls.

Set Ringer Mode

Your phone is set to make sounds when you receive calls, press keys, navigate through menus, and receive alerts (such as new messages). You can silence all sounds and set the phone to vibrate or to light up when you receive calls and alerts.

From **Ringer Mode**, select one of the following:

- Normal Sounds rings for the incoming call
 or alert (in effect, returning the phone to a
 non-silent mode).
- Vibrate Only vibrates for the duration of the incoming call or other alerts.
- Vibrate And Ring vibrates for the duration of the incoming call or other alerts.

From **Touch Feedback**, set the level of vibration feedback when you touch the screen. To preview a vibration level, touch the name.

Set Key and Touch Tone

From **Key and Touch Tone**, select the sound you hear when pressing a key or touching the screen.

Calibrate Touch Sensor

From **Touch Calibration**, follow the prompts to calibrate the touch sensor on your phone.

Set DTMF Length

From **DTMF Length**, set how long the dual-tone multi-frequency (DTMF) tones last when you dial a number.

Voice Features

From **Voice Features**, you can modify the following features.

Enable Automatic Add

From **Automatic Add**, select **Enabled** to automatically add a contact to your voice dial list when you create a new contact.

Enable Expert Mode

From **Expert Mode**, select **Expert** to speak a voice command after you hear a tone instead of following the voice prompts.

Set Display Results

You can set the phone to display up to three contacts when calling or searching for a contact with a voice command.

From **Display Results**, select **Single Best** or **Three Best**

Set Digit Lengths

You can set the number of digits used for a phone number in your voice dial list. From **Digit Lengths**, select one of the following options:

- North American recognizes only 7, 10, and 1 + 10 digits in a phone number.
- Permit All allows 4-14 digits in a phone number.

Voice Answer

Enable Voice Answer

You can set your phone to answer a call with your voice when using a hands-free accessory.

- From Ringer Mode, select Normal Sounds.
- From Headset Sounds, select Out of Headset.
- From Voice Answer, select With Accessory.

Answer Using Voice Answer

When you receive an incoming call, the phone prompts "Incoming call, answer?" With the caller recognized as a contact entry in your phone, the phone prompts "Incoming call from (Name), answer?" Do one of the following:

 Say "Yes" or press any key except the Send key to answer the call.

- Say "No" or press the **End** key to ignore the call.
- Remain silent. The voice alert repeats twice and the phone rings once before returning to the home screen.

- When No Svc alerts you with three tones decreasing in pitch when service is lost and three tones increasing in pitch when service is acquired again.
- On Roam Change alerts you with two decreasing tones when roaming service is acquired and three increasing tones when home area service is acquired again.
- On Any Change alerts you with three increasing tones if there is a change in roaming service or three decreasing tones if the phone loses service.

Set Roaming Restrictions

How does BREW Work?

Your Kyocera phone has the added ability to download and manage applications through BREW.

You connect to the server, download applications, and then manage them as you like. When you choose an application, you have the option of choosing a demo, various limited use options, or the full version—all varying in price. To open the application now, touch **Yes**. If you select **No**, you return to the applications list, where you see your new application.

Note: Your connection to the application server automatically ends after 30 seconds, unless you connect again to download more applications. If you want to end the connection manually, press the **End** key on your phone.
